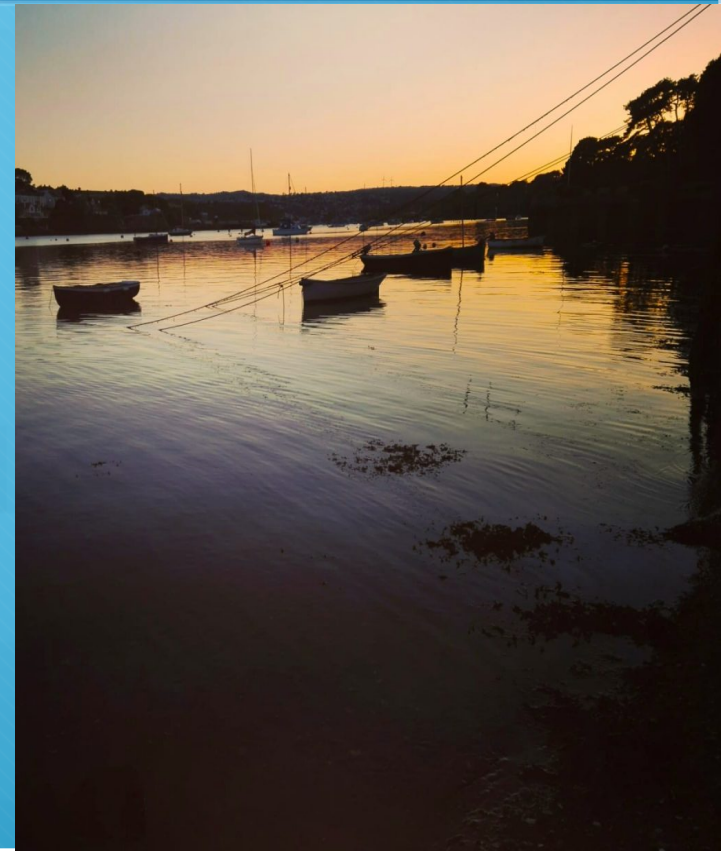

Launching from St Just Creek

One of the great advantages of the Roseland Centre is its proximity to St Just Creek.

Just a 15-minute walk downhill from the Centre, the creek provides access to the Carrick Roads a stunning, deep-water drowned river valley (ria) in Cornwall. Formed after the last Ice Age, it forms part of the Fal Estuary and is famously noted as the third largest natural harbour in the world.

Groups wishing to launch can do so through Pascoe's Boatyard (launching arrangements should be made directly with the boatyard).



Planning your Visit

Please note:

- Launching is subject to a fee.
- Access is tide dependent.
- Groups are responsible for planning their own activities, equipment requirements and safety arrangements.
- The changing tides are part of what makes this environment so special and part of what makes careful planning essential.



A Landscape to Explore

The surrounding waters offer a variety of sailing experiences. From sheltered waters suitable for learning and development to wider estuary sailing for more experienced crews, the area provides a memorable setting for group adventures.

The Roseland Peninsula offers:

- Scenic sailing routes
- Tidal challenges
- Coastal exploration
- Wildlife encounters
- A strong maritime character

Every tide brings a different experience.



More than a Paddling Trip
