- support someone else.

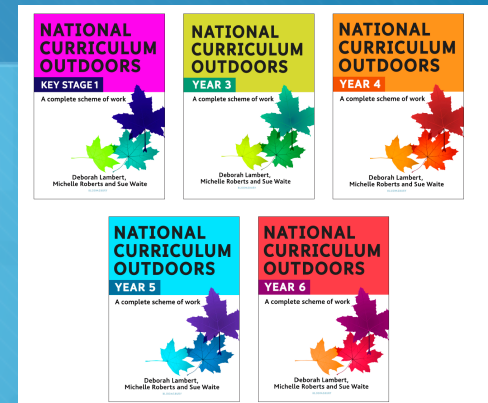
These moments build confidence that travels far beyond the Centre.

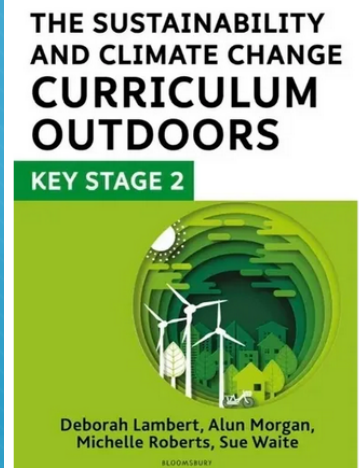
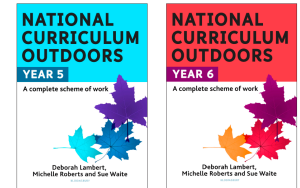
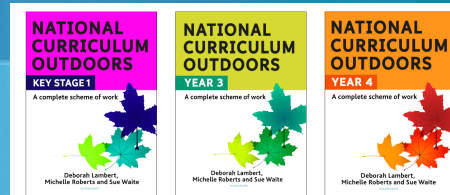

Taking the Curriculum Outdoors

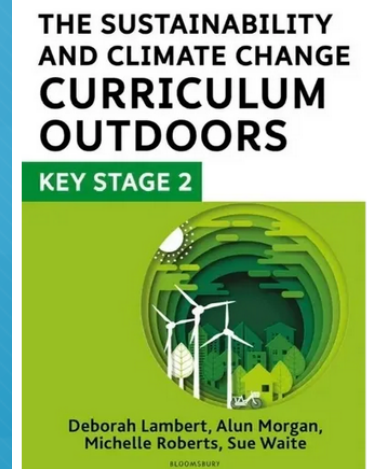
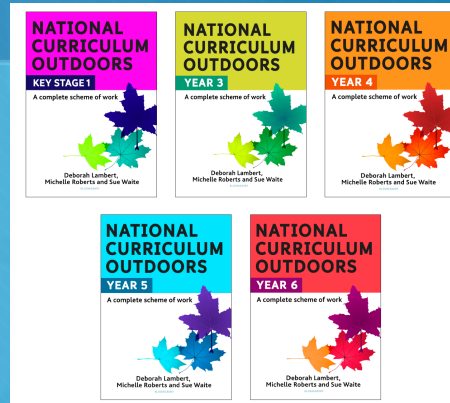
